The CdLS Scientific & Educational Symposium

brings together physicians in various clinical disciplines, scientific researchers, teachers, and allied health professionals.

Through lectures, panel forum and formal discussions, attendees will learn about medical and educational issues facing individuals with the syndrome, as well as an update on current basic science research.

The program begins with a Wednesday afternoon session from 12:30 to 5:15 p.m., followed by an informal dinner at 7 p.m. The Thursday session is from 9 a.m. to 4p.m. A complete schedule will be available in the spring.

At the conclusion of the symposium, participants will have a better understanding of:

- Appreciate the scope of the spectrum of clinical findings in Cornelia de Lange syndrome (CdLS).
- Understand more about the protein cohesin and the genes that are involved in producing CdLS when disturbed.
- Be aware of the types of animal models used to study CdLS and related disorders and how they can be used to study mutations within the genes.
- Realize the applications of work performed in animal models to the clinical entity of CdLS including future treatment.
- Understand and be aware how to manage behavioral and family issues in CdLS.
