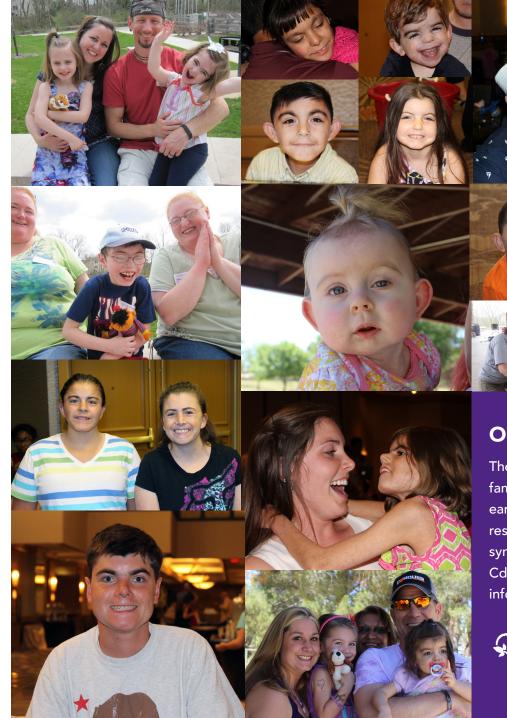

## Message from the Board President & Executive Director

### Small but mighty

Just like the individuals it serves, the CdLS Foundation is small but mighty. Although we have a small staff and small budget, the Foundation makes big differences in the lives of thousands across the United States.

In 2014, we welcomed 125 new families to the CdLS Foundation, facilitated 411 Ask the Expert questions, and responded to 1,648 requests for service (up 20 percent from 2013). Three new publications were printed, covering the topics of transition, education and grief. Additionally, we collaborated with Santa Clara Valley Medical Center in San Jose, CA, to establish the first CdLS Clinic west of the Mississippi River.

It was another good year for the organization's finances. Spending was down and revenue up, resulting in a surplus of just under \$138,000. The National Family Conference in Costa Mesa, CA,

saw a \$50,000+ deficit, but increased revenue from special events like Team CdLS (up 18 percent) helped keep the Foundation in the black.

Without the support of families and friends who gave time, expertise and funds, we could not have had a great year. It is their support that truly makes the Foundation mighty.

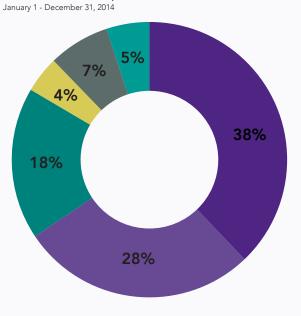
